INVOCATION:

The Invocation was pronounced by Reverend Darrel Lewis of the First Baptist Church.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilmember Payne.

SCHEDULED PUBLIC APPEARANCES:

Mayor Patterson welcomed Jason Griffith, Mrs. Nancy Griffith and Mr. Barry Pomeroy, Jason's Scoutmaster. He explained that last spring Jason approached Councilmember Payne concerning ideas for an Eagle Scout badge. From this meeting came the project which Jason completed. Last May, Jason started the restoration of the locomotive at Armstrong Park. With the help of the fire department, the locomotive was cleaned, then Jason scraped down and primed the steel, treated some rust spots and spray painted the entire locomotive.
